

INFANT BAPTISM: Baptisms are generally celebrated during one of the Sunday Liturgies. Prebaptismal instructions must be completed by the parents at least 3 weeks prior to the celebration of the sacrament. Catholic godparents must obtain a letter of eligibility from their pastors four weeks in advance. Baptisms are never celebrated during the Season of Lent.

Sunday Mass as requested and as a parish during the Easter Season.

From the Pastor's Desk: Please note that the first two pieces of this column are taken from last week's bulletin. They need to be repeated because of their importance and the fact that our attendance was very poor due to the inclemency of the weather.

First I would like to say two things regarding the Mass. First,

hopefully every member of the parish in 2020 knew that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass (physically) was reinstituted. This means that according to Church teaching, to fail to attend mass (physically), unless one is ill or homebound, is a mortal sin. The convenience of watching mass at home or on the internet is no longer a valid reason for not attending Mass. The return to this practice reminds us that part of the reality of Church is community, for Christ is also present in the assembly. If you know of someone who does not come to mass for any unexcused reason, gently ask them to come home. Also, on this point I would like to remind you that staying in the main vestibule during the Sunday Mass does not meet your obligation to attend Mass. When you are not part of the worshipping community physically, you are not considered to be a full, active, conscious participator in the liturgy. Also, I humbly ask that you please consider giving to the "Catholic Ministry Drive." I am the first person to say that you have **every right** to have issues with the bishop and/or the diocese, due to a lack of mindfulness (perceived or real) in regard to parish in the past. Why I am asking you to participate is that I have heard through the grapevine that there may be some type of assessment for parishes who do not meet at least 25% of their goal or higher. Our goal is nearly \$27,500; one fourth of that amount would be \$6,875. Even if we made a modest effort to increase the amount the parish contributes, I believe the diocese would look favorably on this. However, giving to the CMD is a truly a matter of conscience and must be followed (whether you decide to give or not – you will never be judged by your decision by me or this community).

The State of the Parish continues to be healthy. I hoped to offer a class; however, my teaching schedule and my irregular medical appointments prevent me from doing so. I am more that stable and I continue to need your ongoing prayers for me. In light of this and a bit of personal reflection, I am considering a Lenten project called "Partners in Prayer." This is not difficult; if you sign up for this activity you will have someone pray for you during the season of Lent anonymously. You, in return, will have someone praying for you. I strongly encourage you to participate as part of your Lenten observances for 2024.

I would also like to remind you that you can schedule an appointment with me at any time. *These appointments can* involve the sacrament of reconciliation and/or talking about either a general matter or something that tugs at your heart. In any regard, Lent is a time for healing our relationships with God, neighbor, self, and world, and I would enjoy greatly being a part of that process with you. NB: Lent is just one opportunity for this, and I can make myself available at anytime.
