

SACRAMENT OF PENANCE: Confessions are heard regularly on the First Saturday of every month at 3:00—3:30 PM (suspended until Ft. John is well). Confession may ALWAYS be arranged with Fr. John personally by calling the rectory office. Please avail yourselves to this life-giving sacrament!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Scheduled no less than **nine months** prior to the date of marriage. Four preparation sessions with the pastor, as well as all diocesan requirements, must be met. All Catholic candidates for Marriage must be registered, practicing members of a parish at least 6 months prior to scheduling the wedding.

INFANT BAPTISM: Baptisms are generally celebrated during one of the Sunday Liturgies. Prebaptismal instructions must be completed by the parents at least 3 weeks prior to the celebration of the sacrament. Catholic godparents must obtain a letter of eligibility from their pastors four weeks in advance. Baptisms are never celebrated during the Season of Lent.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Celebrated after any Sunday Mass as requested and as a parish during the Easter Season.



On the 1st Sunday of Lent you will need to pick a name from that same container and this person will be your anonymous Prayer partner for Lent. If you cannot place your name today you can do so on Ash Wednesday. Please only pick another name if you happen to pick your own.

From the Pastor's Desk: This week was bad at the beginning but picked up quite well toward the end. As of the writing of this piece (Wednesday) I am feeling strong and stable. Again, I thank you for you for your prayers and ask you to continue to storm heaven by praying to Jesus Christ, and through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton, and Demetrius Gallitzin, servant of God. Please ask that your prayers may be joined with theirs that I may return to good health.

In this Sunday's angelus message, Francis wrote about Jesus goes toward wounded humanity and shows us the face of the Father. It may be that within us there is still the idea of a distant, cold God, indifferent to our fate. On the contrary, the Gospel lets us see that Jesus, after teaching in the synagogue, goes out, so that the Word He has preached may reach, touch and heal people. By doing this, He reveals to us that God is not a detached master who speaks to us from on high; on the contrary, He is a Father filled with love who makes Himself close to us, who visits our homes, and wants to save, liberate, and heal from every ill of the body and spirit. God is always close to us. God's attitude can be expressed in three words: closeness, compassion and tenderness. God makes Himself close to accompany us, tenderly, and to forgive us. Do not forget that God's attitude is closeness, tenderness and compassion.

Jesus' incessant walking challenges us. We might ask ourselves: have we discovered the face of God as the Father of mercy, or do we believe and proclaim a cold God, a distant God? Does faith instill in us the restlessness of journeying or is it an intimist consolation for us, that calms us? Do we pray *just to feel at peace, or does the Word we listen to and preach* make us go out, like Iesus, towards others, to spread God's consolation? It will be good for us to ask ourselves these questions during Lent

I also reflected much on the pope's Wednesday audience and its' message. In his catechesis on the virtues and the vices, he brought us to **SLOTH**, our attention on spiritual apathy and sadness. Saint Paul speaks of a "godly grief" and a "worldly grief (2 Cor 7:10). The former prompts conversion, enabling us to cling to hope and, therefore, leads to joy. The latter stems from dashed hopes and disappointments, eroding the soul with discouragement and sadness. Unlike most vices that seek fleeting pleasures, sadness indulges itself by wallowing in sorrow, hindering spiritual growth. As an antidote to this kind of despondency, the Desert Fathers recommended embracing Christ's resurrection; for the risen Jesus redeems all the happiness that has remained unfulfilled in our lives. May faith cast out fear and Christ's resurrection remove sadness like the stone before his tomb.

BY THE WAY, I wanted to update you on the ongoing Church Maintenance account, i.e., MAP II account, As of this Sunday we have a total of \$37, 722. We had a total a little larger than that; however, we had some significant expenses with the Church and school. All and all, we are doing very well. Please keep up you generous giving, and know that larger amounts are appreciated at any time.
