

**IN LOVING MEMORY:** The Sanctuary Lamp is available for your intentions by calling the parish office. Please attempt to request your intention as early as possible. A \$10 donation is suggested.

**SACRAMENT OF PENANCE:** Confessions are heard regularly on the First Saturday of every month at 3:00—3:30 PM (suspended until Fr. John is well). Confession may ALWAYS be arranged with Fr. John personally by calling the rectory office. Please avail yourselves to this life-giving sacrament!

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Scheduled no less than **nine months** prior to the date of marriage. Four preparation sessions with the pastor, as well as all diocesan requirements, must be met. All Catholic candidates for Marriage must be registered, practicing members of a parish at least 6 months prior to scheduling the weddina.

**INFANT BAPTISM:** Baptisms are generally celebrated during one of the Sunday Liturgies. Prebaptismal instructions must be completed by the parents at least 3 weeks prior to the celebration of the sacrament. Catholic godparents must obtain a letter of eligibility from their pastors four weeks in advance. Baptisms are never celebrated during the Season of Lent.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** Celebrated after any Sunday Mass as requested and as a parish during the Easter Season.

From the Pastor's Desk: This spring has come into season with a great deal of rain. Many people complain about the rain, and rightly so. The flooding waters have caused damage to persons homes and have even left some persons stranded. Even our rectory basement was flooded with 100's of gallons of water. For all the persons whose lives have been effected execrably by the rain, we offer our prayers and any other support that we can give them. However, we can tend to forget the goodness of water. It is a source of life for all animate creature, humans, animals and plants alike. It is also a source of new sacramental existence when used in Christian

mental existence when used in Christian Baptism. Therefore, we should never be horrified by a bit of water hitting you during the sprinkling rite. If you have fear of melting, please sit in the middle of the pew, bring an umbrella or wear a heavy raincoat.



In Pope Francis' celebration of the Angelus last Monday, (due to Easter), he noted that today, Monday of the Octave of Easter, the Gospel (cf. Mt 28:8.15) shows us the joy of the women at the Resurrection of Jesus: the text says they abandoned the tomb with "great joy", and "ran to tell His disciples" (v. 8). This joy, which is born precisely from the living encounter with the Risen One, is a powerful emotion, which impels them to spread and to tell what they have seen. So, the women, on Easter morning, live this experience, but in a much greater way. Why? Because the resurrection of Jesus is not just wonderful news or the happy ending of a story, but something that changes our lives completely, and changes it forever! It is the victory of life over death, this is the Resurrection of Jesus. It is the victory of hope over despondency. How can we nurture this joy? Like the women did: by encountering the Risen One, because He is the source of a joy that never ceases. So, we must hasten to seek Him in the Eucharist, in His forgiveness, in prayer and in lived charity! Joy, when it is shared, grows. We must share the joy of the Risen One.

In his weekly audience on Wednesday, Francis, continues his catechesis on the virtues, turning to the second cardinal virtue, **justice**, which the Catechism describes as "the constant and firm will to give their due to God and neighbour" (No. 1807). Justice is not only a virtue to be practiced by individuals; it is above all a social virtue, for it is directed to the creation of communities in which each person is treated in accordance with his or her innate dignity. Justice is thus the basis of peace. The practice of justice demands the practice of other virtues, such as honesty, integrity, respect for law and commitment to the common good. Jesus calls blessed those who hunger and thirst for righteousness (cf. Mt 5:6). How greatly our world, riven by war and manifest inequality, needs men and women firmly committed to the pursuit of justice, so that the human family can live and flourish in unity, solidarity and peace. {In a very simple way, Justice is the responsible and equitable distributions of rights and responsibilities - FI} May the practice of Justice be part of our celebration of resurrection!
