SACRAMENT OF PENANCE: Confessions are heard regularly on the First Saturday of every month at 3:00—3:30 PM (suspended until Fr. John is well). Confession may ALWAYS be arranged with Fr. John personally by calling the rectory office. Please avail yourselves to this

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Scheduled no less than **nine months** prior to the date of marriage. Four preparation sessions with the pastor, as well as all diocesan requirements, must be met. All Catholic candidates for Marriage must be registered, practicing members of a parish at least 6 months prior to scheduling the weddina.

INFANT BAPTISM: Baptisms are generally celebrated during one of the Sunday Liturgies. Prebaptismal instructions must be completed by the parents at least 3 weeks prior to the celebration of the sacrament. Catholic godparents must obtain a letter of eligibility from their pastors four weeks in advance. Baptisms are never celebrated during the Season of Lent.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Celebrated after any Sunday Mass as requested and as a parish during the Easter Season.

From the Pastor's Desk: Dear friends of Visitation Parish, this week I had a final procedure to procure treatment for my future health needs. When information becomes more solid and finalized, I will share my team's plan of action with you. Until then I encourage you to continue to pray for me to Jesus and to ask the aid of the Blessed Mother and my saintly friends to give me strength and hope during this very important time. Things are doing well here at the parish and I am grateful to all of you for your ongoing liturgical and charitable involvement with our parish family.

During the Sunday Regina Caeli, Pope Francis focuses upon *the gospel of the third Sunday of Easter, where we return to* the Upper Room on the night of Passover and the two disciples on the road to Emmaus have shared their encounter with the Risen Christ when Jesus appears to them all. For Francis, this demonstrates the importance of sharing our faith in the Risen Christ. All too often we waste our conversation on gossip which is of little merit and often does harm. On the contrary, there is also good news, positive and constructive, and one knows how good it is for us to hear good things, and how much better one is when this happens. It is also good to share the realities that, for better or worse, have touched our lives, to help others. Francis notes that everyone of us has encountered the Lord and we struggle to speak about it. Each one of us could speak of seeing how the Lord has touched us, and sharing this, not by being a lecturer to others, but by sharing the unique moments in which we perceived the Lord alive and close, who kindled joy in our hearts or dried our tears, who transmitted confidence and consolation, strength and enthusiasm, or forgiveness, and tenderness. These encounters are ones we should share in all our relationships. Just as it does good to talk about the good inspirations, thoughts, and feelings that help us so much to go forward, and we should also reflect upon our efforts and labors to understand and to progress in the life of faith, perhaps even to repent. If we do this, Jesus will surprise us and make our encounters and our environments even more beautiful. We would do well to think of a decisive moment of liberating faith that we experienced the Risen to share it and help others to grow.

In his ongoing catechesis on the cardinal virtues, This Wednesday, at his general audience, Pope Francis turned to the fourth and final virtue of temperance which the Catechism describes as "the moral virtue that moderates the attraction of pleasures and provides balance in the use of created goods." Temperance is the virtue of self-mastery, of healthy discretion, guiding us to keep desires within the bounds of what is honorable. It helps one to act wisely in every situation, knowing when to speak, when to correct and when silence serves as the best response. In matters of pleasure, temperance prompts us to exercise sound judgment, choosing moderation over excess, enabling us to savor life's pleasures in measured doses. Therefore, strictly speaking, temperance is not about denial of pleasure. Rather, it is in harmony with the Gospel values of littleness, discretion and meekness. By cultivating the virtue of temperance, may we experience the profound joy of living balanced lives, delighting appropriately in the good things bestowed on us by God, the things that really matter. This cardinal virtue often seems to be among the most misinterpreted, for in taking pleasure in the various parts of God's creation, we take pleasure in God.

There will be an important meeting of the combined councils (Parish and Finance) on Wednesday, April 24th, 2024 at 6:00 PM in the rectory meeting room. It is essential that ALL MEM-BERS attended this meeting. We will also be joined by the parish staff who are required to attend. As a result of this meeting, Mass will be celebrated at 12:05 PM this Wednesday and will be followed by adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 1:00 PM. **************
