



Prebaptismal instructions must be completed by the parents at least 3 weeks prior to the celebration of the sacrament. Catholic godparents must obtain a letter of eligibility from their pastors four weeks in advance. Baptisms are never celebrated during the Season of Lent.

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** Celebrated after any Sunday Mass as requested and as a parish during the Faster Season.

**EUCHARISTIC ADORATION:** Every Wednesday and Friday following Mass.

#### From Pope Francis to the Pew:

Below you will find the unabridged text of the Holy Father's Angelus Message this past Sunday. I am providing it in its entirety to show you how well the Pope's recovery is proceeding despite the continuing media reports which are replete with unhelpful speculations. As of this writing, the pope is very much in stable condition.

"Last Wednesday, with the rite of the Ashes, we began Lent, the forty-day-long penitential itinerary that calls us to the conversion of the heart and leads us to the joy of Easter. Let us commit ourselves to making it a time of purification and spiritual renewal, a path of growth in faith, hope and charity. This morning, in Saint Peter's Square, holy Mass was celebrated for the world of volunteering, which is experiencing its own Jubilee. In our societies, too enslaved to market logic, where everything risks being subject to the criterion of interest and the quest for profit, volunteering is prophecy and a sign of hope, because it bears witness to the primacy of gratuitousness, solidarity and service to those most in need. I express my gratitude to those who are engaged in this field: thank you for offering your time and abilities; thank you for the closeness and tenderness with which you care for others, reawakening hope in them!. During my prolonged hospitalization here, I too experience the thoughtfulness of service and the tenderness of care, in particular from the doctors and healthcare workers, whom I thank from the bottom of my heart. And while I am here, I think of the many people who in various ways are close to the sick, and who are for them a sign of the Lord's presence. We need this, the "miracle of tenderness" which accompanies those who are in adversity, bringing a little light into the night of pain. I would like to thank all those who are showing their closeness to me in prayer: heartfelt thanks to you all! I pray for you too. And I join spiritually with those who in the coming days will participate in the spiritual Exercises of the Roman Curia. Together let us continue to invoke the gift of peace, in particular in tormented Ukraine, Palestine, Israel, Lebanon, Myanmar, Sudan and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In particular, I have learned with concern of the resumption of violence in some areas of Syria: I hope that they cease definitively, with full respect for all ethnic and religious components of society, especially civilians. I entrust you all to the maternal intercession of the Virgin Mary."

Pope Francis was unable to prepare his weekly **Wednesday** catechesis. Therefore, I am providing you with the following article concerning the anniversary of his election to the papacy and his current state of health as of Thursday afternoon.

### Pope Francis' Anniversary and Health Update

Pope Francis marked his 12th anniversary as pontiff on Thursday with positive medical updates nearly a month after he was hospitalized with double pneumonia. In the Vatican's latest medical bulletin on Tuesday, it said a chest X-ray had confirmed improvements just two days after doctors declared that the pope was no longer at imminent risk of death. However, the "general picture remains complex", the bulletin read. The Holy See has not said how the anniversary of Pope Francis' election as the 266th pontiff might be commemorated. It is a public holiday at the Vatican and masses are planned in his honor at churches in Rome. No medical bulletins will be issued. Pope Francis on Wednesday remotely followed a Lenten spiritual retreat that has been a mainstay of his papacy. He continues to receive high

flows of oxygen through nasal tubes during the day and a non-invasive mechanical mask to aid his rest at night.

Pope Francis' leading papal and political figures in Italy have praised the pontiff this week to mark the anniversary. "I would like to address a thought of gratitude to the Holy Father for his tireless commitment to peace, dialogue and human dignity," Italian Senate speaker Ignazio La Russa wrote on Facebook. "His magisterium is a point of reference for millions of people," he added.

Cardinal Michael Czerny, a senior Vatican official, said the pope's anniversary was a "reason for gratitude". "This year, his illness makes us especially aware (of the anniversary), especially grateful to God, and redoubling our prayers for his full recovery," he said. Pope Francis has been carrying out some of his duties while in hospital, continuing with ecclesiastical appointments and delivering messages of gratitude to his well-wishers.

The former Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio was elected on the fifth ballot of the 2013 conclave, which was called after Pope Benedict XVI resigned. While Pope Francis has praised his predecessor's humility in stepping down and said he might follow in his footsteps, more recently he has said the papacy is a job for life.

Please continue to pray for our Holy Father. One of his dreams is to see the Jubilee Year to his fulfilment. Despite his issues with his health, he is in full command of his mental faculties as well as his ability to be an authentic spiritual leader for the global Catholic family. It is my humble request that all members of our Catholic family here at Visitation Parish offer one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and One Glory Be for Pope Francis throughout the season of Lent until we celebrate the fullness of the Paschal Mystery at Easter.
