

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Scheduled no less than **nine months** prior to the date of marriage. Four preparation sessions with the pastor, as well as all diocesan requirements, must be met. All Catholic candidates for Marriage must be registered, practicing members of a parish at least 6 months prior to scheduling the wedding. There are NO EX-CEPTIONS.

INFANT BAPTISM: Baptisms are generally celebrated during one of the Sunday Liturgies. Prebaptismal instructions must be completed by the parents at least 3 weeks prior to the celebration of the sacrament. Catholic godparents must obtain a letter of eligibility from their pastors four weeks in advance. Baptisms are never celebrated during the Season of Lent.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Celebrated after any Sunday Mass as requested and as a parish during the Easter Season.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION: Every Wednesday and Friday following Mass.



From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Friends of Visitation Parish, I am sitting in the parish office at 12:55 AM on Friday morning, having just returned from my conference Ongoing Formation of Clergy and I had to do this very quick rewrite for the weekly bulletin. We were sitting in our last meeting this afternoon in St. Paul, MN and on my iPhone came the announcement: THE SMOKE IS WHITE. We immediately interrupted the meeting and patiently waited for the announcement. And then it came: At 7:14 PM Rome time, about an hour after the smoke, the Cardinal Proto-Deacon came to the central balcony of St. Peter's Basilica to announce the name of the new pope. He made the announcement in Latin: "Annuntia vobis gaudium magnum: Habemus papam!" "I announce to you a great joy: We have a pope!" Then to the surprise of the entire world, he announced the name of the Cardinal who would be pope: Robert Cardinal Francis Provost, O.S.A. The first American-born pope, Leo XIV came onto the balcony at 7:23 PM Rome time to roars from the crowd of 10's of thousands: His first words as Holy Father were in Italian: Peace be with all of you!

There is much you will have read in the papers, or on the internet, or watched on the news about his biography; however, I would like to share something else with you. As he referenced his background in his initial address to those gathered in Saint Peter's Square he said: "I am a son of Saint Augustine, an Augustinian." With you I am a Christian, for you a bishop, so we may all walk together toward the homeland that God has prepared for us." I think that is important to note that the new pope is grounding his ministry in the Risen Christ." Peace be with you were the first words of the Risen Christ to the Apostles in the upper room that first Easter night when he appeared to them. They were meant to free them from fear. These words were meant for courage. These words were meant for inspiration for evangelization. Pope Leo XIV's adoption of these words are meant to be the same for us as the Church embarks on a new era – one where the continuity of concern for peace, care for the poor in all their manifestations, bridge building, creative fidelity, and unwavering hope are all pillars of the ecclesial community we are proud to call home.

Mothers and "Father" - This Sunday is a beautiful day for both the mothers of our Parish and our Pastor. This Sunday is Mother's Day, a day when the Church and the world honors women who embraced the vocation of Motherhood. It is a difficult yet completely fulfilling vocation that requires unconditional love, not unlike the love that God has for each one of us. The beautiful thing is that for most mothers this comes naturally, but this doesn't mean that it does not involve sacrifice and even at times suffering. Moms, you can never know how we appreciate this and how much we love you for it. Like God's love, we could never earn it, but it is difficult to imagine life without it. This Sunday also happens to be the 29th anniversary of priesthood of our pastor, Fr. John. In fact, in August, he will have been our pastor for 10 years. Fr. John loves us very much as his own family, his own people, his own flock who he attempts to shepherd gently, creatively and faithfully to the fullness of God's Kingdom. If you have a moment, remember him in you conversations with our Lord, along with your mothers, today.
