From the Pastor's Desk

I spent this past week at Antiochene Village in Bolivar, PA on retreat with 21 other priests of our diocese and Bishop Mark. Although I was "in charge" since priest retreats come under the purview of my office (Ongoing Formation of the Clergy and Clergy Services), it was a very prayerful and uplifting week for me. In terms of the conferences that were held, the theme focused upon the "Eucharist as the center of Priestly Life and Identity." They were very well developed, rooted in Scripture, theology, and the teachings of recent popes including Saint John Paul II, Pope Francis, and Pope Leo XIV. The retreat allowed ample time for personal reflection and an opportunity to celebrate a penance service with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Adoration and Benediction (over which I had the pleasure of presiding) and an opportunity for individual celebration of the sacrament of reconciliation with several of the Benedictine Fathers from Saint Vincent Archabbey in nearby Latrobe. We also had time for priestly fraternity each evening with a planned social. This is one of the times that I valued most since most of us are "lone rangers" (that is, we live alone in our parishes), and we do not get to see one another socially. You cannot understand fully, unless you are a priest, how important fraternity among the presbyterate (the priests) is. It is a sacred bond to be cherished. That sense of continuing community, along with important ongoing liturgical, spiritual, pastoral, and intellectual formation are my goals for my position as Director of Ongoing Formation, etc.) Please pray for me in this regard, for if I succeed, our priests, and ultimately all of our members of the faithful throughout the diocese, will be better for it. Also, please pray for all our priests and for more "home grown" vocations to the priesthood. This is not to say that we do not value the generosity of the men who have come to help from other countries, but it certainly would be more than fine to uncover some of the priestly vocations that I am convinced are present here in the diocese.
