From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends of Visitation Parish,

Throughout my life, especially in recent years I have always maintained my trust in God's love and mercy. My hope has aways been well placed, for when I needed God most, He always came through for me (E.g., my liver transplant, comforting me at the death of my father, blessing me with life-giving assignments in my priestly ministry). I cannot deny however, that this past summer and fall have been very difficult for me. You are already aware of the life-threatening illness that I had to endure during the second half of July (my recovery being another sign of God's goodness). I have been dealing with several other health issues as well over the past several months. Cataract surgery that was originally scheduled for the middle of June was cancelled not once, not twice, but three times. This last cancellation has resulted in my having to find a new ophthalmologist in Pittsburgh because my condition has become so critical. At this point, I can no longer see out of my left eye (ergo, the reason for the patch I was wearing at Mass). I can no longer drive and my ability to read has been severely compromised. I have no idea when I will be having surgery...that depends upon the appointment that I have on Tuesday, October 14th (thanks be to God).

In addition, the complications that accompany my use of cyclosporine (the life-long anti-rejection medication that I take daily) have greatly escalated over the past several months. The incredible pain from the gout that effects almost every joint in my body (but especially my hands, my hips, and my left ankle) has intensified (the reason for my slow and protracted movements at Mass). Also, the deleterious effect of the drug on my kidneys has increased resulting in the need for increased diuretics with only modest success (I am currently holding on to more than 25 pounds of water weight). We are working with my nephrologist to determine a more effective course of treatment, but for now know that I am in great discomfort.

I share this information with you not to draw attention to myself (for anyone who knows me I do not wish undue attention). And I am most certainly not an invalid. I tell you this to be transparent with my health issues and because I am asking you for your prayers. As I began, I trust in God and know that everything will eventually work out. Your prayerful support most importantly will give me the courage to endure.
